Seeing and Responding

Matthew 9:35-38 ³⁵ And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in

their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction.

³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had (was moved with) compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless (weary & scattered; distressed & downcast), like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few

³⁸ therefore pray earnestly (plead) to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

I am thankful that Jesus is intentional and active in His mission. We know that God came to us when we could not get to Him. He sought Adam and Eve as they hid in the Garden (Genesis 3:9), and He has been seeking His lost loved ones ever since. Jesus

gave His mission statement in Luke 19:10: The Son of Man came to seek and to save the use me for His purposes? Or am I content lost. The Savior pursued us and did what was necessary to redeem us: but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8). He is still on mission, and we have the privilege of joining Him in His pursuit.

Matthew 9:35-38 reveals the actions of Jesus that serve as an example for us: he went, he taught, he proclaimed, he healed, he saw, he felt (had compassion), and he instructed. He was seeing what was going on around him, and he was responding with the heart of a loving Savior.

Do we see (and respond to with compassion) those who are harassed, helpless, weary, scattered, distressed, downcast? Do we see a plentiful harvest around us- in our neighborhoods and workplaces? And if we see, are we responding like Jesus?

Verse 36 says that he was "moved with compassion." He did not just have a feeling; he was moved to action. I am challenged

with this... do I desire God to move me and with half-hearted obedience that makes me comfortable?

The harvest is plentiful. It is the Lord's harvest and he has already been at work. Jesus instructs us to pray earnestly for the Lord to send out laborers. When we pray our hearts and actions will align- we will be the ones going, and others will be motivated to move and do so as well.

Movement creates (motivates, stimulates, encourages) movement. When we move toward the things that God instructs and prompts us to, God moves in our hearts, and our hearts are moved for the things of God. We begin to see people differently and respond with compassion.

Are we going, are we seeing, are we feeling, and are we responding? May God be glorified in and through us as we see and respond as Jesus did (and still does)!
