You will then have access to all of the video training modules held by Sampson Resources. In fact, you can give the password to anyone in your church. They can study on their own, lead a small group, catch up on a missed module, or just peruse the different materials and the possibilities for training and growing our congregations.

Our prayer is that this will be a great help for all of our churches, but especially for our bi-vocational and single-staff pastors. If you will, please give me some feedback. Let me know how you are using these materials, and if they are being helpful to you. At the end of the “year,” we will determine if we will continue to use this service.
