#### Hebrews 10:19-25

19 Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, 20 by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, 21 and since we have a great priest over the house of God, 22 let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. 23 Let us

hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing

Make no mistake, the true fellowship we enjoy is only possible because of what Christ has done for us. Our relationship with one another is built on the relationship we first have with Him. We can have confidence and full assurance in this vertical relationship with God because "He who promised is faithful", and this gives definition and meaning to the horizontal relationships we have with one another.

This passage reminds us that something special happens when believers come together. We should consider how we can "stir up" and encourage one another to love and good works. We must be intentional in this pursuit of Christ-centered, relational

interaction with one another.

The foundational idea of an association is that churches choose to partner together for a common purpose, to fulfill a mission. This association should not be in name only, but should reflect the active participation that is described in Hebrews 10. We each should consider how we can actively pursue relationships that stir us up and spur us on to love and good works.

I desperately want to pursue this relationship with each of you. Will you join me? I will continue to reach out and set up meetings in the days ahead. 


