



Resurrection Reboot

12 Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? **13** But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. **14** And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. **15** We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified about God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. **16** For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. **17** And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. **18** Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. **19** If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied. (1 Cor 15:12-19)

The Resurrection. Is it important to us? The way we celebrate it, you wouldn't think so. Churches put much more emphasis on Christmas than they do on Resurrection Sunday. You don't believe me? Look around. Check out the activities of your church during the time we typically call Easter. Compare what you do during the Easter season to the things that take place during the Christmas season. Compare what happens during this season with all the other churches in your community. It's pretty revealing, isn't it? The most important day in all of Christendom is not really given its due.

It doesn't have to be this way. We can change. May I challenge us to reboot. It's not too late to change things even for this year. Begin to pray. Ask God how you could celebrate the Resurrection more fully this year individually and as a church. Then, begin to make plans for your biological families and church families. Study the Bible concerning the few weeks before the crucifixion. Have a special emphasis of the Resurrection the week before Easter Sunday, observing everything that happened to Jesus and his disciples that week. Mourn on "Good Friday." Mourn that the King of Glory paid such a high price for us! Then, have a glorious blow-out on Easter Sunday morning. Hold nothing back! This is

something we should celebrate with resounding "Hallelujahs!!!"

Perhaps if the world sees that this day means more to us than all the other days, they will realize we are serious about our faith, and not the commercial celebration Christmas has become. It may just make a tremendous difference in our witness.

This year, and in the years ahead, let's show that we (Carolina Baptist Association) take the Resurrection seriously. Let's show that we know the scripture. Let's show that we know that without the Resurrection, we would have no hope.

Then, let's go tell the world, beginning in our Jerusalem, that they can know of the same Hope we have. The hope that is in Christ, His sacrifice, and His Resurrection!

Gone But Not Forgotten

For many of us, Hurricane Matthew has come and gone. But for many others, the effects are felt every day. We do not want to fall prey to "out of sight, out of mind."

There are still 500 families in motels and they do not have access to food. We had groups that were cooking meals and bringing it in and serving in the parking lots, but the managers stopped that at Christmas. The Baptist Men are not cooking meals anymore—just for volunteers who are staying overnight. SO they are desperate for gift cards for food—we are giving away grocery cards so they can get cereal (these are motel 6 type lodging with no breakfast) or sandwich things; We have *McDonalds, Burger King, Wendy's, Cook-Out, KFC, Taco Bell, Chick Filet, Subway, Pizza Hutt, Domino's Papa John's, Cici's Pizza, Lil Ceasar's, etc.* Most of the chains—plus *Ruby Tuesday's, Outback, etc.*

They also need money for laundry mats. A few hotels are letting them use their laundry facilities, but not all. Some families are spending a lot of money on gas trying to get children back to their previous schools since buses are not providing transportation from the hotels to some schools. One family at our school had missed 3 days because they were looking all the way from Laurinburg to Florence, SC to try to find an affordable place to move into and had to take their kids with them. So, gas gift cards are helpful as well.

Will you consider sharing a meal with another family? The next time you go out to eat or to the grocery store, purchase a gift card to send and share for a family I need. 


